## A DOG'S DAY AFTERNOON

Treat your four-legged friends to an outing in the Inland Empire that caters to their canine tastes.

**WHEN YOU** want to go out with your best friend, you need the right kind of place. Here are some favorite IE spots that welcome you and your dog in style.

**Molly's Souper, Upland:** While you are enjoying your omelet on the terrace at this converted 1912 Craftsman home, order chicken pieces from the canine menu for your canine companion. The place for Upland dogs to meet and greet. 388 1st Ave., Upland. (909) 982-1114.

**Oak Mountain Winery, Temecula:** On any weekend you're likely to see a well-mannered pug enjoying biscuits and H<sub>2</sub>O at the next patio table. Oak Mountain is one of several Temecula wineries that bills itself as dog-friendly. "For Pete's Sake" wines feature a picture of the amiable winery mascot. 36522 Via Verde, Temecula. (951) 699-9102.

**Dog Park Cafe, Temecula:** You can eat inside the pet store with your dog. ("No dog, no service.") For the humans, you can order sandwiches, salads and sushi from Baron's Marketplace take-out menu, which will be delivered to your table. The dumpling, pot pie, and pumpkin dogsert pie come in small dog (\$3.99) and large dog portions (\$4.99).



**Jackboy's Bakery, Corona:** Jackboy's Bakery makes a lot of the swell-sounding biscuits and treats sold at pet boutiques, including the Dog Park Cafe. This is the place to order custom cakes in flavors that include chicken jerky and peanut butter, or molasses and cheddar cheese. See [jackboysbakery.com](http://jackboysbakery.com)

**Some Crust Bakery, Claremont:** Dogs have been known to steer their people straight to this bakery and sandwich spot in the Village. Cookie for you, biscuit for Fido. A pack of 12 biscuits is \$4.75. Sit outside and enjoy the scene. 119 Yale Ave. Claremont. (909) 621-9772.

**Johnny Rockets, Chino Hills:** The restaurant's patio service offers a doggie hamburger, lickety split ice cream, pupcakes, and carob ruffles. The Shoppes at Chino Hills, 19865 City Center Drive, Suite

3093, Chino Hills. (909) 627-3366.

**Agua Caliente:** The Rancho Mirage casino-resort welcomes dogs. A special hangtag on the door will alert staff that you brought the pooch. A few restrictions apply; call for details. 1-888-999-1995, [hotwatercasino.com](http://hotwatercasino.com).

## CRUISE CONTROL

RE-ROUTE YOURSELF AROUND CONGESTION AND TRAFFIC WITH THE AID OF IE511.ORG, A WEBSITE THAT ALLOWS DRIVERS TO KNOW TRAFFIC CONDITIONS BEFORE THEY GO.

**TO GET AROUND** the I.E. with as little effort as possible, check [www.ie511.org](http://www.ie511.org) before you get in your car. Robert Yates (pictured), director of Multimodal Services at the Riverside County Transportation

Commission (RCTC), says the system—a partnership among RCTC, San Bernardino Associated Governments, Cal Trans and the California Highway Patrol—lets you check for incidents, travel time and

travel speed on freeways through your computer, phone, or mobile devices. If use your hands-free cell phone to call 511 from the road, he says:

- Turn off your radio
- Speak slowly

• Enunciate  
"It's a computer, so it has to recognize what you say," Yates says. To date, the system can't offer alternate routes. To plan your next trip, see [www.ie511.org](http://www.ie511.org).
